Joan Grzybowski joined the Board of Directors of the National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants (NCCPA) in January 2020 as the American Osteopathic Association (AOA) nominee.

Dr. Grzybowski is a Physician and Clinical Instructor at the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine (PCOM).
