Peggy Riley Robinson joined the Board of Directors of the National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants (NCCPA) in January 2014, as the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB) nominee.

Robinson is a graduate of the Duke University PA program and is currently an Associate Professor in the Department of Community and Family Medicine at Duke University Medical Center. She practiced Family Medicine for 20 years and is now the Director of Curriculum for Duke's PA Program. For the past three decades, she has been educating the next generation of PA clinicians and leaders. Her work has been published in several peer-reviewed medical journals such as the *Journal of the American Academy of Physician Assistants*, the *Journal of Clinical Microbiology* and the *Journal of Physician Assistant Education*.

Robinson has been active in FSMB, the North Carolina Academy of PAs and the Physician Assistant Education Association (PAEA). She was also a member of the North Carolina Medical Board from 2006-2012. She's been recognized as Duke University's School of Medicine Master Clinician/Teacher, PAEA's Master Faculty Recipient and Duke University's Richard J. Scheele Memorial Award recipient for outstanding academic performance. Robinson was recently honored to receive the 2018 Duke University Physician Assistant Program Distinguished Alumnus of the Year Award.
